Funding Increase Will Support More Services for Survivors

Jewish Family Service is a major source of support to our region's Holocaust Survivor community. JFS provides a wide range of supportive services to more than 450 Survivors each year, helping them remain healthy, independent and connected to the community around them.

These services are funded, in large part, by the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany (Claims Conference), which also manages restitution payments to Survivors from the German government and other institutions with culpability for the Holocaust.

At the end of 2014, the Claims Conference announced it would provide JFS with a significant increase in funding to support services for Survivors, recognizing the growing needs of the aging Survivor community and the efficacy of the agency's programs.

This increase of more than \$1 million—up more than 100% from 2014—will help JFS greatly expand home care, escorted transportation and other critical services to provide a greater level of support to a greater number of people.

We're thankful for the expansion of these resources, and honored to serve Metro Detroit's Survivor community every day. ■
