A person struggling with substance use disorder can walk into any participating police department or community partner and ask for help. They will be greeted with compassion and respect.

A volunteer Angel will be called to help with paperwork and phone calls, and to provide support until a treatment option is found.

Recovery Coach Services

All participants and their families will be offered the services of a recovery coach.

Peer Recovery Coaches have at least 2 years of continuous sobriety and help participants set goals and overcome obstacles to early recovery.

Family Recovery Coaches have lived experience and work directly with family members to help them find peace and regain control of their lives.

There is no charge for any of these services.
