In Detroit, 7,000 Soviet Jews arrived and Jewish Family Service, as the Refugee Resettlement agency, played a central role in helping these newcomers acclimate to their new lives.

Natan Sharansky

A leader in the struggle for the rights of Soviet Jews, Natan Sharansky spent nine years in prison on trumped up charges of treason and espionage, and was released only after massive public campaigns. He made aliya on the very day of his release, and eventually served in four successive Israeli governments, as Minister and Deputy Prime Minister. In 2009 he was appointed Chairman of the Executive of the Jewish Agency for Israel.

The author of three books and the recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor and the Presidential Medal of Freedom, Mr. Sharansky remains a champion of the right of all people to live in freedom.
